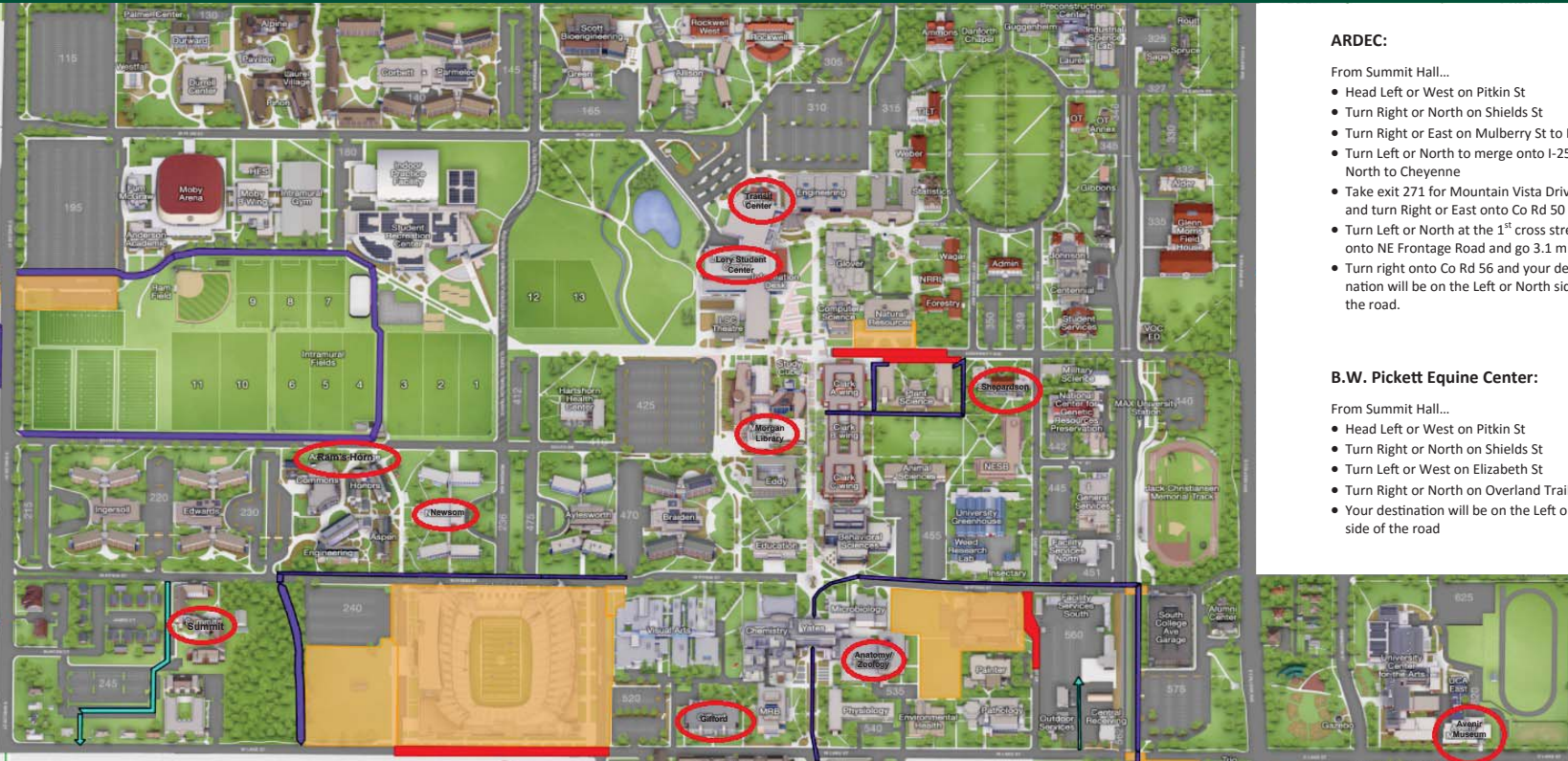

 - Turn Right or East on Mulberry St to I-25
 - Turn Left or North to merge onto I-25 North to Cheyenne
 - Take exit 271 for Mountain Vista Drive and turn Right or East onto Co Rd 50
 - Turn Left or North at the 1st cross street onto NE Frontage Road and go 3.1 miles
 - Turn right onto Co Rd 56 and your destination will be on the Left or North side of the road.

Casual

Gays	Jeans, khakis, t-shirts, tennis shoes, does not include cut-offs or worn jeans with holes or ragged edges.
Girls	Same as for guys. Shorts must be midlength length. No cutoff shorts or short-shorts allowed. Spaghetti straps, shirts which expose a bare back, halter tops, and tube tops are prohibited. Tank tops with straps wider than one inch are permitted.
