Project Tips:

- Completed e-record and entomology workbook in a sturdy binder/notebook.
- Acceptable sizes of Entomology Display Boxes (these boxes are all in either the manual or kit):
 - 12W x 16L x 3" Deep
 - 12W x 18L x 3 ½" Deep
 - 18W x 24L x 3 ½ " Deep
 - All commercially available display cases are acceptable.
- Standard insect pins are required for all units.
- Enter your exhibit in the county fair.
- For unit 7 which is self determined here are some ideas:
 - Select a topic of your choice and decide what your goals would be. i.e. Studying a rare insect.
 - Record your goals and plan of action in the goal segment of the E-record. i.e. It will take three months to learn about the rare insect.
 - Fill out the E-record as you work on your project that you selected. i.e. Record any costs incurred and any inventory of tools or equipment used.
 - Record your accomplishments in the story section of the E-record. Share what worked well and what didn't.
 - Additional supportive materials may be put in a sturdy binder with your E-record. i.e. Any written plans or information gathered to learn about the rare insect.

Judging Criteria For E-Record and Workbook:

- Completeness of answers for each question in the kit
- Extra activities such as demonstrations, talks, and community service recorded in your e-record.
- Would be nice if community service was related to your project
- Neatness and legibility, is your collection well organized
- Proper pinning, using insect pins, is very important.
- The quality of the insects (i.e. no missing parts)
- In your story it is very important to tell what you have learned over the past year.
- Documented evidence of activities
- Incorrect identification and improper or sloppy labeling will be counted down
- Checks for what insects the member collected the current year. If no, or only a few, new insects were collected, it is marked down.
- Follow instructions for the unit submitted from the Exhibit Requirements. Know the number of insects required, display box sizes, etc.
- Project displays will lose points for: incorrect identification, improper or sloppy labeling, improper pinning, disorganized collection.
