Project Tips:

- For this self determined project here are some tips:
 - Select a topic of your choice and decide what your goals would be. i.e. Identifying grasses in a pasture
 - Record your goals and plan of action in the goal segment of the E-record. i.e. It will take three months to learn the how to identify the grasses.
 - Fill out the E-record as you work on your project that you selected. i.e. Record any costs incurred and any inventory of tools or equipment used.
 - Record your accomplishments in the story section of the E-record. Share what worked well and what didn't.
 - Exhibit a showboard related to your project. i.e. mapped pasture with all the grasses identified.
 - Additional supportive materials may be put in a sturdy binder with your E-record. i.e. Any written plans or information gathered to learn how to identify the grasses.
- Enter your exhibit in the county fair.
- Share the information learned through talks and demonstrations.

Judging Criteria For E-Record and Supplement:

- Completeness of your e-record
- Extra activities such as demonstrations, talks, and community service recorded in your e-record.
- Would be nice if community service was related to your project
- Neatness and legibility
- How you completed your plan.
- Quality of exhibit
