## Project Tips:

- In Units 3 and 4, members select a chapter to focus on during this project year.
- Unit 3 chapters cover arts and crafts, play, music, and rhythm, stories and poems, and snacks as it pertains to infants, toddlers, and preschoolers. Unit 3 members can stay in this unit for more than one year by taking a different chapter each year.
- Unit 4 chapters cover guidance and discipline, parties, mealtime, safety and careers. Members can stay in this unit for more than one year by taking a different chapter each year.
- Members are to complete the More to Grow On questions at the end of each chapter studied.
- Follow unit requirements and rules in the state fair exhibit requirements.
- Give a demonstration about something you learned in this project and also help with a community service project relating to child development.
- Enter your exhibit in the county fair.
- Share the information learned in a demonstration or a display.

## Judging Criteria:

- Completeness of e-record indicating what the 4-H member has learned.
- Overall outstanding exhibit follows these criteria: attractive, relatively simple, colorful and/or showing strong contrast, creative or artistic, sturdy (won't fall apart in transit), educational, intriguing and gives viewer the impression that you enjoyed your project.
- Makes the viewer remark "wow" or "nicely done".
- E-record includes: demonstration, talks, story and pictures with at least one action shot of the member doing something with their project.
- Neat and legible.
